

Dear Emmaus Community,

I want to thank you for the honor to be lay director of Walk 127. What an amazing opportunity that I will remember for a lifetime. I am so excited to see what God has planned for us as a community with the fall Flights and Walks. Every time I get to serve, I feel like that walk/flight was better than the last, but I am realizing that is because I see God working in me and others in new ways. I see things being done that I didn't know needed done. As lay director, I got to see several of these things and thought I would take advantage of this opportunity to write a letter to the community to share what they may not be aware of. Agape is not just for the pilgrims, but for the team.

Did you know that the team is made up of first timers, somewhat experienced, and very experienced community members? Did you also know that when serving for your first time you can only serve on agape or kitchen team? Did you know that when following those guidelines and ratios that typically a team should only have 6 first time team members? That is really difficult because typically we gain 60-72 men and 60-72 women per year. Most of them want to serve after having just been on their walk. So, I think this list below is vital because as you see below there are so many opportunities to be a part of the walks and team. Being part of the team out at camp is great, but selflessly loving others with out them always knowing...... that sounds like how our Heavenly Father loves us. We would not have a growing and successful community if people were not already doing these things. I am grateful for all of you who already do them. I just wanted to share the opportunity with new community members. Also don't hesitate to ask new members to help you if you are doing some of these things, or things that I missed. That is what makes our community so special to me. The love we have for each other. There is a reason Cindy named the camp "Love View" because our love for one another is visible, by the invisible way we love.

- 1. Pre-talk and post-talk agape. These letters or "agape" encourage the speaker letting them know that you love and support them.
- 2. Piano player for agape meal. This adds such a beautiful touch to the agape meal, if you are blessed with this talent, you can always reach out to the lay director and volunteer (usually an ALD oversees this, but the lay director will know which one)
- Agape meal servers. I think everyone is aware of this opportunity, so I won't go into detail on this one. The only thing I would add is the skits really amplify this special time, so if you are serving you might be thinking of a skit you would want to help with.
- 4. Thursday night pilgrim monitor. After sendoff and sponsors hour you stay and are there for 30-60 minutes to allow the team to have their first team meeting. The pilgrims are in silence, so you are there just incase they need something. I always feel bad as an ALD asking someone to do this, so if you feel this fits you, you can always volunteer.
- 5. Candlelight camp watch. When the bus/vans leave the camp for candlelight someone stays at the camp and just makes sure everything is secure. All the cabins and lodges are left unlocked during this time. I really feel bad asking someone to miss candlelight, but I know candlelight isn't always everyone's thing, so if that is you..... feel free to call the lay director and vol-

- 6. Meal during training. Volunteering to make a meal for the team. I have seen this done by a reunion group but not very often recently..... at least on the men's training. If you want to bless and support the team this is a great one to volunteer for.
- 7. Taking a number to pray for. This has always been such a blessing when I have had the opportunity to do this. I am really grateful for those that organize this. Typically, 1-2 Gatherings before the walk you can sign up for a number. The order that the pilgrims sign up is tracked and you receive a text that gives you a name to go with the number you have been praying for. You can also write an agape letter to this pilgrim letting them know you've been praying for them before you even had a name to go with the number, how special for that pilgrim to be showered with love in this way!
- 8. Prayer chart. This one has been struggling to get filled. I hate to see that, because what better way to selflessly love someone than to pray for them. If we want to have an impact on a walk, lives of those working or attending a walk, our community and families, then we have to take this opportunity seriously and with excitement! Our conversation with our Heavenly Father changes things. If we are not a praying community, we will quickly become a weak and struggling community. There is power in prayer. This one not only blesses those being prayed for, but the person praying.
- 9. Candlelight cleanup. This usually gets dropped on the church hosting it, which isn't always fair. Several hands make this work light. Most of it is putting away tables and chairs after the community has written any last-minute agape letters. If you want to volunteer to help with this, contact the board person listed as facilities on the website.
- 10. Closing/Camp cleanup. Another opportunity to serve behind the scenes. This is loading all the supplies used at camp back into the trailer so they can go to storage. The agape and kitchen team typically have a majority of this ready and can be loaded right before closing. All it requires is to show up early for closing. If you want to volunteer to help with this, contact the board person listed as supplies on the website.
