The Upper Room Walk to Emmaus held their first Walks in 1978. The oldest communities are 27 years old. The Columbus community held their first Walk in March of 1993. We are now almost thirteen years old. That makes our community grown-up and middle-aged. We are in our prime! And like any wise prime-timer, we had a check-up this year.

The Triennial Training check-up our community received in August was timely and quite revealing. Admittedly, much of the training was a bit stressful and hard work as Cathi Eberly, our North Central Regional Representative, pointed out areas where our walk could come more in line with the Upper Room model. But, there was a time that morning that everyone got excited. Cathi contrasted the abundance and even excess with which many established communities in the United States carry out their Walks with those of communities in developing countries. In a developing country, agape may be a single tea bag. Paper and office supplies are lacking. What was the most astounding to me was that it costs about \$250,000 for each start-up community! Though that sounds incredible, once she explained all the flights and accommodations needed as members fly to and from the community to help with its first walks, it sounded reasonable. The excitement came as the trainees enthusiastically asked a good and right question, "How can we help a developing community?"

Even closer to home . . .in fact, right in our own house is the Chrysalis community. Cathi encouraged us to make Chrysalis our primary mission outreach. Any investment into the spiritual lives of our youth is precious.

When our community was an infant and growing up, it was appropriate for us to seek help from older communities and keep our focus on our own growth and development. God has blessed us as we have built His kingdom here in our community. We are now a community that is mature and in its prime. Our Triennial check-up revealed to me that we couldn't continue to feast at a spiritual buffet without working out those blessings on a regular basis. We will just end up fat with blessings among the starving of the world.

As 2005 starts to wind down, please be in thought and prayer as to how our prime-time community can start the new year by working out to be a blessing to others.

What's New in Sponsoring?

There are lots of jobs in the Emmaus community. One can serve as a musician, in the kitchen, on the board or as a walk LD. But there is one job that is the most dear to our hearts and the most important of all . . . **sponsorship**!

A few weeks ago there was a fourth day meeting that educated and gave guidance to those who wanted to learn how to sponsor. If you were not able to attend, there are still several ways to become a wise sponsor:

- Ask YOUR **sponsor** to help you be a sponsor the first couple times.
- ZE Go to the **Community Member Page** at www.columbusinemmaus.org/members/ Help Documents for Walks and Other Events / 1) Sponsor's Checklist 2) Suggestions for Sponsors 3) Emmaus Sponsorship
- **ME** A booklet from the Upper Room library called **Sponsorship**.
- ZZA future Fourth Day meeting following a set of walks.
- ZZ The newsletter has information to help you be a wise sponsor.
- **EX** Attend **gatherings** to receive reminders and updates

Let me tell you something new from the board meeting last Saturday. Listen up, because this is going to change the way we do business!

Applications are due and in the hands of the registrar 30 days prior to the start date of the walk.

Let's use the spring walks as a specific example. The Men's Walk #59 send-off is on April 20. Applications for men attending that walk will need to be in our registrar's hands by March 20. The Women's Walk #60 send-off is on April 27. The application for any woman attending that walk will need to be in the registrar's hands by March 27.

If an application is handed in less than 30 days prior to a spring walk, please do not consider it "missing the deadline". Consider it being at the top of the list for the fall walk!

Remember . . . applications for Pilgrims may be turned in 365 days of the year. Waiting until a walk is almost upon us should not be your cue to sponsor. Give your gift of sponsorship to a friend or family member as a Christmas present this year!

If a minimum of 20 applications is not received at that time of the deadline, the walk will be canceled.

This is more of an issue for the men's walks than the women's, so keep that in mind.

Maximum 36 pilgrims on a walk.

This was a strong recommendation from our Upper Room Regional Representative at the Triennial Training in August. It also would preserve the quality of the walk the way the Upper Room intended. What this means to us as a community is that we may see a waiting list to attend a walk begin to form again. Handing in an application earlier rather than later would increase the possibility of a Pilgrim attending this coming walk.

"What did this Walk to Emmaus mean to you?" and "What are you going to do about it?"

We experienced every emotion a human being can have . . . and we made some up, too! / I never experienced God's love like at this weekend. / Where He goes, I will follow. I will be His hands and feet. / Who am I to deserve this? It's all because of the grace of God. / The walk has allowed me to get rid of some baggage that I've carried for far too long. / He's convicted me that He expects more out of me. / I have not cried quite as much as in these last few days. / I'm going to let the Christ that is in me work through me. / My mission is to set people's hearts on fire. / I found out that I was a nobody, but with Christ I'm a somebody. / Here I am. Send me! / I don't think that I was a dead Christian, just one in a deep coma. . . . by the grace of God, I'm going to come back stronger . . . and look out! / When God poured His love, His word and His strength in me, all the garbage ran out. / This has meant the world to me. / I never knew how to take it to the next level. Now I do. / When my son, my sponsor, said, "check it out", I had to go. / I have an all-new meaning of love. / We were the good-looking table. Things that haven't contributed to the great commission in my life will have to go. / I didn't realize that there could be this much love in the Christian community . . . boundless love, endless love, unearned love. / God can take dead situations and bring them back to life. / If you are not crying within five minutes, they feed you. / I'm going to spread that love to everyone I can. / Pastors are paid to be good. Lay people are good . . . for nothing. / I forgot how much God loved me. / Stay the course, because in the end, we win. / There's nothing that happens through us that doesn't first happen to us. / He has given me the courage to come forward to tell others what a glorious God He is. / God does not call the enabled, He enables the called. / These three days have been a cleansing. / I have never experienced so much love! / I can't imagine that heaven is any better than this! / I want to be a light for the Lord, because He is awesome. / I hope that people see me, they see that God's grace is sufficient. The past is behind. / This weekend was Windex for my windows. / I'm new in my faith. This has been perfect. / I can't share Christ if I don't know Him. I am going to do a daily Bible study. / God showed me that you don't know a person until you walk in his shoes. / I knew that I had to have Him and get back to Him if I was going to survive. / I feel like I had cataracts removed. / I lost both my mother and my father in the past 14 months. Now I don't feel like an orphan. / This has been a little bit of heaven on earth. / I've had a chance here to see what lavish love is.


