The Most Important Job in Emmaus

The February Gathering was a special one for me. I had the privilege of giving a Fourth Day talk. I felt that God wanted me to tell how He has shown His love to me throughout my life. What came out clearly as I reviewed His goodness was that a lot of His love came through my involvement in this Emmaus community these past ten years. I would have missed out on this special kind of love if Bob and Nancy had not invited and sponsored me to attend Walk #11 in April of '95.

Now is the time that community members are getting excited about serving on team and preparing agape for the April Walks. But what I would like to see the community members get the most excited about is the *most important job in Emmaus: sponsorship*. When I see Pilgrim vacancies on any of the Walks, I feel a certain sadness. I realize that it is possible that God had one of His beloved children in mind to attend, but someone may have been disobedient in not inviting them. That absent Pilgrim missed out on a

Let's check our hearts and see if God has a name written there for these walks.

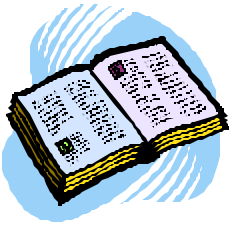

Report on Flight 17

Our scripture was 1 Cor. 13:13 "these three things remain, faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love." The talk song chosen was "I Will Never Be the Same Again". That became the mantle of how we all approached the flights. In team meetings we learned how to love one another better. We overcame many obstacles. God gave us extraordinary wisdom to handle some extraordinary circumstances. Becky and I received a lot of love, support and encouragement from both youth and adults on team. To the team members that served, again THANK YOU for hearing God's gentle call and for serving with the tender and loving nature that only comes from Christ.

Fri. Jan. 14 - The evening that the team arrived, we all shared in a powerful service of love. We shared our hearts and concerns; we laughed; we cried; we prayed; and then we placed the teams and the caterpillars in the Hands of our Heavenly Father.

Sat. Jan 15 - The caterpillars arrived. The guys seemed a bit apprehensive, but willing to take each moment as it came. Our photographer, because of an accident, was late, but no problem - we just did a schedule shift. All day long we experienced each moment to the fullest: wonderful talks, great music, fantastic meals, and the agape team making sure we wanted for nothing. We came to the poster party with full stomachs, a song in our heart, and many new friends.

Prodigal was powerful as each caterpillar and each team member nailed a burden or a sin to the cross. The caterpillars then went to bed in silence, as did the team, to reflect, to find something new in our hearts about God.

Sunday, Jan. 16 - We woke up to something new indeed. God covered our world with a most beautiful and wonderful blanket of snow. What a reminder of His grace, for though our sins be as crimson, they shall become as white as snow. Day two is Chrysalis Day, a day of change. Each talk was powerful and you knew the caterpillars were beginning to become excited about being there. Experiencing a snowbound Big House, team members pitched in and handled the agape dinner. Your love and your Christ like presence at Candlelight blew us all away. Thank you, community, for your sacrifice on our behalf. Many of the young people left things at the alter, finding a new freedom in Christ.

Closing brought laughter and tears as every caterpillar from flights 17/18 shared from their hearts what God had poured into them. Becky and I were blessed.
